#### **RMHC WA Impact At A Glance**

### Family Wellbeing 2022

In 2022, the overall wellbeing of families prior to RMHC WA's support was 10% lower than data recorded in 2021. This is likely due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and rising costs of living that Western Australians experienced during the year.

The overall wellbeing scores of families supported by RMHC WA in 2022, across emotional, financial, cultural and environmental wellbeing, increased by 26% compared to an increase of 17% measured in 2021.

RMHC WA's support had its highest impact on the emotional and financial wellbeing of families with a 31% increase in wellbeing.

A critical insight from the report highlighted that parents and carers believed if they had not been able to access RMHC WA support, their families' wellbeing would have further declined in their circumstances. In particular, 83% of families stated that if they had not been able to stay at RMHC WA, their emotional wellbeing would have been poor or very poor.

#### **Emotional Wellbeing**

Prior to RMHC WA support approximately 1 in 3 families were experiencing poor to very poor emotional wellbeing.

With RMHC WA's support 67% reported their emotional wellbeing was good to very good and ratings for poor to very poor emotional wellbeing was reduced by 25%.

In feedback, parents and carers highlighted the social connection with other families and their shared experience as a major contributor to improved emotional wellbeing.

#### **Cultural** Wellbeing

70% of families stated their cultural wellbeing was good or very good prior to RMHC WA's support increased to 90% of families of during their stay at RMHC WA.

55% of families stated their cultural wellbeing would have been low or very low if they had not been able to stay at RMHC WA for their child's treatment.

Overall, RMHC WA had a slightly higher impact on cultural wellbeing in 2022 compared with 2021 with an increased impact rating of 4.4 to 4.5 out of 5.



#### **Environment Wellbeing**

Families placed a very high wellbeing value to their family home environments which was equally matched in their experience in RMHC WA 'home-away-from-home' environments.

93% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that without the RMHC WA family-centred environment, they would have experienced stress on their family's wellbeing.



#### Financial Wellbeing

Prior to RMHC WA support approximately 1 in 3 families were experiencing stressful financial wellbeing.

With RMHC WA's support, 71% reported their financial wellbeing as manageable an easy to manage.

RMHC WA had a higher impact on the financial wellbeing of Aboriginal families than non-Aboriginal families during their stay but their financial wellbeing remained lower after RMHC WA support compared to non-Aboriginal families.
